
recommended their names for onward action for their settlement in the land under the scheme. However, as per fishermen no further action was taken in this regard.

Life has no Remote Control. Get up and Change it Yourself.

Falling short

To overlook the orgy of communal hatred at a recent event in Haridwar that was labelled a Hindu religious congregation as an inconsequential derangement of a fringe group may be a convenient pretext for the inaction by the police and the silence of the ruling Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), but the reality is scary. The passivity of the BJP is a signifier and eloquent admission of the pernicious mainstreaming of bigotry. The Uttarakhand police have betrayed a cavalier attitude in their investigation by not naming any of the ringleaders, initially, and not showing the urgency the case requires, subsequently. Speakers at the event openly called for genocide and violence. Such bigotry is not the monopoly of adherents of any particular religion, and law enforcement authorities should be eternally vigilant. The murder of two people at Sikh places of worship in Punjab in separate incidents in recent days showed how matters of religion can inflame irrational passion. In one case in Punjab, a person has been arrested and charged with murder. The shameful lynchings were followed by responses from organisations ranging from the Congress to the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh, but none unequivocally condemned the violence. Most reactions appeared to justify the violence, privileging abstract religious sentiments over the fundamental right to life. The Congress chief in Punjab, Navjot Singh Sidhu, spoke for many politicians seeking to exploit religion for electoral purposes when he said those who offended the faith must be hanged publicly.

That mainstream parties are unable to take an unambiguous and universal position that violence and the call for violence, in the name of faith, are unacceptable is unsettling and bodes ill for Indian democracy. Despite sporadic bursts of communal violence, India, unlike its neighbours in South Asia, has survived and thrived as a multicultural and multi-religious nation till date. Keeping it that way requires vigilance and vision. Violence originates in thought, transmits itself through speech and manifests itself in action. Targets in the recent past have ranged from interfaith couples to carol singers to cattle traders to teachers setting question papers. New laws appear to reinforce and institutionalise prejudice and intolerance. The heavy hand of the state that falls too frequently on the critics of the Government has left the mobs that threaten national unity untouched. Those who committed murder in Punjab, those who called for mass murder from Haridwar and those who vandalised Christian institutions in different places must all be brought to justice as per the law. Political parties must rise above their narrow interests during the current election cycle and unite against hate. Later may be too late.

turnover of the FBO through online and deliver at their doorsteps. It is also to ensure that no food business is operating without a valid FSSAI License/Registration Certificates.

The Food Safety officers detailed the participants about the complete online process of uploading applications and the procedures to make modifications in licenses. Around 628 new Food Business Operators/Registration Certificate holders were covered in the drives conducted at six places. All queries of FBO's related to Licence/Registration were cleared by the FSO's on the spot.

The Commissioner of Food Safety/Deputy Commissioner, South Andaman has insisted all FBOs that since FSSAI has made it mandatory to register and display the FSSAI License/Registration Number on receipts/invoices/cash memo/bill etc. by the FBOs during the sale of food products w.e.f 1st Jan, 2022, strict enforcement drives ensuring compliance with the said direction will be taken by Food Safety Department from the succeeding month.

Lt. Governor Launches Janbhagidari Programme and Initiated Vegetable Seed Distribution

Independence and the Government of India has curated a series of innovative programmes to celebrate the Mahotsav under the overall spirit of "Janbhagidari and Jan Andolan".

Taking cue from the Hon'ble Prime Minister of India's vision, the UT of A&N Islands has launched Janbhagidari Programme for Evaluation of Government Flagshipschemes of GOI being implemented in this UT by Andaman and Nicobar Administration to ascertain that the actual benefit is reaching the last mile.

At present, 68 Centrally Sponsored Schemes and Schemes of A&N Administration are being implemented in A&N Islands wherein benefits are directly being released to the end beneficiaries either in cash (through Bank) or kind. The Administration has planned to take an initiative to evaluate the actual benefit being reached to the beneficiaries through implementation of various schemes of Government of India and UT Administration through Janbhagidari process. The objective of this process is to evaluate, 'How effectively the benefits under the schemes are reaching up to the end beneficiary?; Whether the beneficiaries are actually benefitted by the scheme or not?; Whether the households are satisfied by the delivery mechanism of the scheme?;

The detailed analysis of Flagship Schemes of GOI and UT Administration shall be done through Janbhagidari with the support of the SHG members of Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana- National Rural Livelihood Mission (DAY-NRLM) and National Urban Livelihood Mission (NULM).

During the event, the Hon'ble Lt. Governor has also inaugurated the programme for distribution of Vegetable Seed Mini-Kit to the Islanders to have self-sustainability in food supply. Knowing the issue of insufficient food supply during the lockdown period due to outbreak of COVID-19, the Hon'ble Home Minister had advised the UT to start campaign for food self-sufficiency during his visit to A&N Islands. On this ground, the Administration of UT of A&N Islands has initiated the distribution of 50000 Vegetable Seeds Mini Kits procured from National Seeds Corporation, Chennai among the Islanders free of cost. Each kit comprises of 4 types of open pollinated vegetable seeds, namely Amaranthus (Marsa), Brinjal (Egg-plant), Okra (Bhindi) and Cow pea (Lobia), so that the beneficiaries can preserve the seeds for growing in the coming season.

Addressing the gathering on the occasion, the Chief Secretary, A&N Administration highlighted the appreciable works being done by the members of Self Help Groups (SHG) across India. He appreciated the activities being done by the SHGs of A&N Islands such as SHE markets, catering services through GeM, sale of handicraft through GeM, sale of grounded masalas, farming activities, Sakhi Saheli Café, Social Audit of RD Programmes, Swachh Survekshan and many more. Knowing the efficient work done by the SHG members in the Islands, he encouraged them to help t Administration to conduct survey for evaluation of the Centrally Sponsored Schemes and UT schemes being implemented in this UT and to check the actual benefit reaching the end beneficiaries. Also, he encouraged the SHG members to make nutri-gardens in their house with the vegetable seed mini-kits provided by the Agriculture Department to have sustainable supply of nutritional diet for their family with less dependence on market. He also directed the Education and Social Welfare Departments to take up development of nutri-garden in the School and Anganwadi compounds and use the produce for providing nutritional mid-day meal to the children.

The Secretary (RD) gave the welcome address and the Secretary (Planning) delivered vote of thanks during the



DCC President Requests for Pollution Testing Centre at Bambooflat

Port Blair, Dec. 29: The District Congress Committee President, Shri. V.K Abdul Aziz has requested the Secretary (Transport) to start one pollution testing centre at Bambooflat.

In a letter to Secretary (Transport), Aziz highlighted the difficulty faced by residents of Bambooflatin coming at Port

Blair for conducting "Pollution Under Control Test". He mentioned that the process is very time consuming and it is not possible to complete the process in a day.

He added that, bringing vehicles from Bambooflat to Port Blair through vehicle ferry just for getting a PUC certificate will cause hardship for the residents of Bambooflat. He therefore requested the Secretary (Transport) to start one pollution testing centre at Bambooflat.

COVID-19 Status in A&N Islands

Port Blair, Dec. 29: During the RT-PCR test conducted on 502 passengers who arrived here yesterday, one positive case has been detected. Today, 12 flights with 2107 passengers arrived, out of which, 1641 were vaccinated with both doses while RT-PCR test was conducted on 466 passengers (includes 20 international travellers) and the reports are awaited.

During RAT conducted on 154 passengers bound for North & Middle Andaman at Ferrargunj no positive case has been detected. At Mohanpura Bus Terminus, test was conducted on 48 passengers and all were found negative. At Phoenix Bay Jetty, 58 passengers were tested with RAT and all were found negative. At Helipad, test was conducted on 11 passengers and all were found negative. RTPCR test was conducted on 48 crew members of MV Chowra, the report of which is awaited.

Today, till 3 pm 187 eligible beneficiaries were vaccinated out of which 167 were in the age group of 18-44 years.

Member of Parliament Demands Atleast One Pollution Testing Center at Baratang, Kadamtala and Billiground Areas

Port Blair, Dec. 29: The Member of Parliament, Mr. Kuldeep Rai Sharma has requested the Chief Secretary of A & N Administration direct the concerned departments to open atleast one pollution testing centers each at Baratang, Kadamtala and Billiground areas so that people of these regions can get pollution test done for their vehicle, without any trouble.

In a letter addressed to the Chief Secretary, the Member of Parliament today said that the Andaman Nicobar Administration has started "Catch the Polluter" drive and has announced a heavy penalty on vehicle owners, who don't have a

PUC certificate. Like always, law-abiding people of Andaman & Nicobar Islands have taken this direction positively and are trying their best to get PUC certificates from different pollution testing centers.

He pointed out that from Baratang to the Mayabunder region there is only one pollution testing center at Rangat.

The Member of Parliament said that Middle Andaman is a vast region and taking a two-wheeler, three-wheeler or four-wheeler from places like Baratang to Rangat, just to get a PUC certificate is a difficult task, which in many cases is not possible to complete in one day.

He mentioned that the condition of ATR is also not favourable for two-wheelers and three-wheelers for such a long distance journey.

The MP added that People of the Middle Andaman region are now worried that in case they fail to get a PUC certificate on time, they will have to pay a hefty fine, which most of the Islanders can't afford.

Sharma also pointed out that the people of Andaman & Nicobar Islands are willing to get pollution tests done for their vehicle and get a PUC certificate but people of Middle Andaman have the genuine problem of reaching a pollution testing center.

Revenue Department Carries Out Encroachment Eviction Drive at Shoal Bay


