Compulsory PUC Certificate for motor vehicles

Traffic Police cash in on without giving adequate time for motorists to get their vehicles tested

Port Blair. Dec.26: Barely into a couple of days of the Chief Secretary, A&N Admn issuing a direction making it compulsory for all motor vehicles to possess PUC certificate, the traffic police which otherwise play hide and seek games to trap drunk and driving, started cashing in on the situation. Complaints have started pouring in from general public that, traffic police on duty have started penalising motorists for possessing PUC certificate from the day one. This

comes as a time when only a handful of pollution checking units being in operation in the city. While a centre situated at Mohanpura is temporarily halted over license issues, two more centres in Junglighat, Haddo and Dollygunj are reportedly functional to cater to the testing requirement of thousands of vehicles plying within the city.

Ever since the news of the diktat published in the newspaper stipulating

Omicron less likely to put you in the hospital, studies say

Two new British studies provide some early hints that the omicron variant of the coronavirus may be milder than the delta version. Scientists stress that even if the findings of these early studies hold up, any reductions in severity need to be weighed against the fact omicron spreads much faster than delta and is more able to evade vaccines. Sheer numbers of infections could still overwhelm hospitals.

Still, the new studies released Wednes day seem to bolster earlier research that suggests omicron may not be as harmful as the delta variant said Manuel Ascano Jr., a Vanderbilt University biochemist who studies viruses.

"Cautious optimism is perhaps the best way to look at this, " he said. An analysis from the Imperial College London COVID-19 response team estimated hospitalization risks for omicron cases in England, finding people infected with the variant are around 20per cent less likely to go to the hospital at all than those infected with the delta variant, and 40per cent less likely to be hospitalized for a night or more.

That analysis included all cases of COVID-19 confirmed by PCR tests in England in the first half of December in which the variant could be identified: 56,000 cases of omicron and 269,000 cases of delta.

A separate study out of Scotland, by



scientists at the University of Edinburgh and other experts, suggested the risk of hospitalization was twothirds less with omicron than delta. But that study pointed out that the nearly 24.000 omicron cases in Scotland were predo minantly among younger adults ages 20-39. Younger people are much less likely to develop severe cases of COVID-19

"This national investigation is one of the first to show that Omicron is less likely to result in COVID-19 hospitalization than Delta " researchers wrote. While the findings are early observations, "they are encouraging," the authors wrote.

The findings have not yet been reviewed by other experts, the gold standard in scientific research. Ascano noted the studies have limitations For example, the findings are specific to a certain point in time during a quickly changing situation in the United Kingdom and other countries may not fare the same wav.

Matthew Binnicker. director of clinical virology at Mayo Clinic in Rochester, Minnesota, said that in the Scottish study, the percentage of younger people was almost twice as high for the omicron group compared with the delta group, and that "could have biased the conclusions to less severe outcomes caused by omicron."

He nonetheless said the data were interesting and suggest omicron might lead to less severe disease. But he added: "It's important to emphasize that if omicron has a much higher transmission compared to delta, the absolute number of people requiring hospitalization might still increase, despite less severe disease in most cases."

Data out of South Africa where the variant was first detected, have also suggested omicron might be milder there. Salim Abdool Karim, a clinical infectious disease epidemiologist in South Africa, said earlier this week that the rate of admissions to hospitals was far lower for omicron than it was for delta.

"Our overall admission rate is in the region of around 2per cent to 4per cent compared to previously, where it was closer to 20per cent," he said. "So even though we're seeing a lot of cases, very few are being

with various patient characteristics. Identifying order of symptom onset of infectious diseases might aid in differentiating symptomatic infections earlier in a population thereby enabling nonpharmaceutical intervent ions & reducing disease spread, they said.

The study, publish ed in the journal PLOS Computational Biology, used modelling approach to predict symptom order in a set of 373,883 cases in the US between January and May 2020.

The most likely symptom order differed between the initial outbreak in China where fever most often preceded cough, and nausea or vomiting was a common third symptom and the subsequent spread to the US. In the US, cough was most likely to be the first symptom, and diarrhoea was a more common third symptom.

Ву analysing additional data from Brazil, Hong Kong and Japan, the team showed

that the different order of symptoms was associated not with geographic region, weather, or patient characteristics, but with SARS-CoV-2 variants.

The presence of the D614G variant in an area - which was predomi nant in the US in early 2020 — was associated with a higher likelihood of cough being the first COVID-19 symptom experienced by patients.

As Japan shifted from the original Wuhan reference strain to the D614G variant, symptom order shifted as well, the researchers said. The study authors hypothe sise that the increased transmission of D614G could be linked to the symptom order "These findings indicate that symptom order can change with mutation in viral disease and raise the possibility that D614G variant is more transmissible because infected people are more likely to cough in public before being incapacitated with fever," they added.

Novavax says COVID vaccine triggers immune response to Omicron variant

Novavax Inc's COVID-19 vaccine is effective in generating an immune response against the Omicron variant, according to early data published on Wednesday, suggesting that the U.S. drugmaker's existing COVID-19 vaccine can help combat the new Omicron variant

Novavax's twoprotein-based vaccine was authorized for use this week by European Union regulators and the World Health Organization. It has previously been approved by countries including Indonesia and the Philippines but not the United States.

Novavax said that receiving an additional booster dose of Novavax's vaccine further increased people's immune response to Omicron. The data was taken from Novavax's ongoing studies of its vaccine's effectiveness in adolescents & as a booster. "We are encouraged that



boosted responses against variants were comparable to those associated with high vaccine efficacy in our Phase 3 clinical trials," said Gregory M. Glenn, Novavax's president of research & development.

Other COVID-19 vaccine manufacturers, including Pfizer Inc. and Moderna Inc., also increase immune responses to Omicron, early data from those companies has shown. Resistance in all cases is stronger in people who have received an additional booster dose. Novavax is working on developing an Omicron- Novavax's vaccine.

specific vaccine and said Wednesday it expects to begin manufacturing doses of the variant-specific shot in January. The drugmaker will start shipping vaccines to the EU's 27 member states in January as part of its deal to supply up to 200 million doses. T h e company will also begin shipments in early 2022 to COVAX, a vaccine distribution mechanism overseen by WHO that allocates COVID-19 shots to poorer countries. Novavax and its partner, Serum Institute of India, have agreed to send COVAX more than 1.1 billion doses of

Face can tell if you're rich or poor

People can guess if an individual is rich or poor just by looking at their face, and such indicators can even influence job prospects, a study has

Using an annual median family income of about \$75,000 as a benchmark, researchers from University of Toronto in Canada grouped student volunteers into those with total family incomes under \$60,000 or above \$100,000 and then had them pose for photos with neutral faces devoid of expression.

They then asked a separate group of participants to look at the photos and, using nothing but their gut instinct, decide which ones were 'rich or poor' just by looking at the

The team was able to determine which student belonged to the rich or poor group with about 53 per cent accuracy, a level that exceeds random chance

Researchers also found that this indicator of a person's economic standing may even act as a 'self-fulfilling prophecy' that influences social interactions. "Those first



impressions can become a sort of self-fulfilling prophecy. It's going to influence your interactions, and the opportunities you have," said Thora Bjornsdottir, PhD student at University of Toronto.

"What we are seeing is students who are just 18-22-years-old have already accumulated enough life experience that it has visibly changed and shaped their face to the point you can tell what their socio-economic standing or social class is," said Nicholas Rule, associate professor at University of Toronto.

"Over time, your comes permanently reflect and reveal your experiences. Even when we think we're not expressing something, relics of those emotions are still there," Rule added.

There are neurons in the brain that specialise in facial recognition. The face is the first thing you notice

a hefty penalty for violators, general public possessing motorcycles and cars have started queuing up before a few available pollution checking centres. The one in Haddo witnessed a long serpentine queue since 23rd December 2021. Like wise, other centres in Junglighat & Dollyguni too witnessed similar situation.

There are thousands of motor vehicles plying across South Andaman which include heavy cargo vehicles, heavy passenger vehicles, light motor vehicles, autorickshaws and motorcycles. On an average it takes about 10 to 15 mts for a vehicle to be tested and going by this timing, a unit can test up to 60 vehicles in a day with ten hours of service. Considering the number of vehicles plying in South Andaman and given the limited number of testing centres across the city. it will take atleast a month for all vehicles to get tested and the action of police to penalise the PUC violators are premature and untimely. Due to the sudden orders of the administration, the general public is on a panic mode

and the untimely penalty imposed by police for PUC violations add to the flames, it is complained.

Alleging further, general public points to large scale emission from government owned fleets such as STS buses. departmental trucks besides numerous heavy vehicles hired by government agencies such as PBMC to clear garbage. Most of the stagecarriages bearing "A" and "B" serial registration numbers are the worst polluters with the blessings of the authorities, it is further alleged. First of all, authorities should clamp down on the vehicles under the government fleets as they ply uncontrollably on the roads without the fear of being penalised by the Traffic police. Almost all the old buses in the STS fleet bad emitters. Autorickshaws which are not suitable for the local topography becomes worst emitters within months of deployment.

Ignoring the top emitters such as STS buses, private stage carriages, departmental and private trucks, the

traffic police are playing hide and seek with innocent motorcyclists. It is hard to see any motorcycle emitting smoke and the traffic police on duty do not care about it and simply ask the motorist to produce PUC Certificate.

General Public demand that, administration should have given atleast a month time for all vehicles to get pollution tested as it is premature for the traffic police to penalise the helpless motorcyclists and private cars without giving adequate time to get the PUC tested Hence motorists demand that time may be given atleast till 31st January 2022 enabling all to get their vehicles tested emission.

Let's hope that, the Chief Secretary who ordered the rule considers this plea and give the motorists adequate time for testing of vehicles. In the meantime, if the number of testing units is increased by immediately renewing the lapsed licences, it will also help ease the congestion by enabling a speedy testing procedure.

Similarly, fire crackers are also not to be used at any time in the areas designat ed as silence zones i.e,

an area at least 100 meter away from hospitals, nursing homes, primary and district health-care centres. educational institutions, courts, religious places or any other area declared as a silence zone by the authorities concerned General public is also advised to earmark common central places in every locality/area where people could gather and burst fire crackers within the prescribed limits of time i.e. from 11.55 PM to 12.30 AM and permitted noise levels. Any violation in this matter will be dealt promptly as per the law.
