NO TAKERS OF CS DIRECTIONS IN DIRECTORATE OF IP

Port Blair, Sept. 14: Despite repeated request to the top brass of Directorate of Information & Publicity to designate a Public Relation Officer (PRO) for better coordination with the local print media as also for clarification of media related doubts and queries, the Department of IP&T has yet to take a call on the issue. The Directorate of IP&T is the nodal agency looking after media affairs in the Islands. However, despite repeated requests and pleas with the top brass of IP&T, till date no PRO has been designated due to which the local media have to face difficulties. A team of media persons recently met the Chief Secretary and apprised him about the situation. Accordingly, the Chief Secretary directed the top brass of the Directorate of IP&T to look into the issues of local media. Media team also met the Secretary, IP&T and Director, IP&T and apprised them of their issues. Despite assurance, the local media is still awaiting for a PRO to be designated by IP&T to deal with the media. In addition to this, daily print media has also been facing problems due to late night release of press releases by IP&T. Important functions attended by the Lt Governor and Chief Secretary are released to the private print media very late after 10.30 pm. As a result of late night release, most daily print media have to either avoid the important news or publish the story on the next day's edition which results in the news losing its relevance as the official media already published the news. Meanwhile, a media team today visited IP&T office to express their gratitude to the Director of IP&T for issuing directions to various departments under the administration for clearing the pending advertisement bills. However, the media team had to return back without meeting the Director as he was too busy to meet the media team.

One convicted for rape

Port Blair, Sept. 14: The Hon'ble Special Judge, Shri Raja Chatterjee on 13th September, 2022 convicted one accused persons namely S. Meganathan @ Chinna, resident of Chakkargaon Village, Port Blair in a rape case committed by him against a minor girl then aged about 6 years. It is averred that on 23.07.2012 the victim girl's parent had been to hospital for medical check-up by leaving behind the victim alone at home and on their return the mother of the victim found the victim crying and there was an injury on her and on enquiry she disclosed that the accused who happens to be the son of the house owner committed rape upon her. Then she was immediately shifted to G.B. Pant Hospital. The prosecution examined 14 witnesses and the Hon'ble Court after conducting trial found the accused person guilty of the offence and sentenced him to suffer 10 years rigorous imprisonment under Section 376(2)(f) of IPC and ordered him to pay a fine of Rs. 10,000/- in default further rigorous imprisonment for 06 months. The case was conducted for and on behalf of the State by Special Public Prosecutor Miss. A.S. Zinu.

Moonlighting & market

Alongside WFH, moonlighting – employees doing jobs on the side of their contracted full-time work – expanded exponentially during the pandemic, particularly among techies. The grey zone outside of office hours in which pre-pandemic moonlighting operated, really flourished with Covid blurring home and office. AKA side-hustle, moonlighting is in the crosshairs of some major employers, who are also keen to restore white-collar work to its pre-pandemic definitions. With employees in many places resisting status quo ante, the open secret of moonlighting in the IT sector had to be confronted head on by employers. Infosys has called it “two-timing” and the Wipro chairman called it “cheating, plain and simple”. But Swiggy and Cred are greenlighting moonlighting. It's a reflection of how employer-employee relationships are in great chum right now. But this turbulence is not the same across white-collar jobs.

WFH made stark the deep fault line between white-collar workers and the rest. Likewise moonlighting opportunities gravitate to specific groups, especially where demand outstrips supply. A PwC survey tellingly found 54% of respondents strongly/moderately agreeing that India faces a shortage of their skill sets. It's complicated, so no wonder even HR managers, never shy of reminding employees of the binding nature of contracts, are divided. Some are worrying about side-hustles lowering office productivity and causing IP leaks and conflicts of interest – understandable concerns. But other HR mavens are open to the idea of companies working productively with employees without having exclusive ‘ownership’ of them. They will cite experts who argue that moonlighting can help one do one's day job better. An American study published in the Academy of Management Journal last year found that side-hustles made employees feel empowered, and the resulting uplift in mood actually improved their mainline performance. The thing, though, is all managerial positions and employee options will ultimately be decided by unsentimental market forces. In a booming sector that's short of skilled people, employers will be hard-pressed to punish moonlighting. In a sectoral labour market where employers call the shots, moonlighting will probably be punished.

NOVEL PLASTIC FILM CAN KILL COVID VIRUS USING JUST ROOM LIGHT

Scientists in the UK have developed a plastic film that can kill the SARS-CoV-2 virus particles which land on its surface with just room light

The self-sterilising film developed by a team at Queen's University Belfast, UK, is less costly to produce, can be readily scaled and used for disposable aprons, tablecloths, and curtains in hospitals. The film is coated with a thin layer of particles that absorb ultraviolet (UV) light and produce reactive oxygen species – ROS.

These kill viruses, including SARS-CoV-2, the researchers said. The technology used to create the film also ensures it is degradable – unlike the current disposable plastic films – making it environment-friendly, the researchers said.

The research, published in the Journal of Photochemistry and Photobiology B: Biology, could lead to a significant reduction in the transmission of viruses in healthcare

environments but also in other settings that uses plastic films.

The researchers tested the film for anti-viral activity using four different viruses -- two strains of influenza A virus, a highly-stable

picornavirus called EMCV and SARS-CoV-2.

They exposed the film to either UV-A radiation or with light from a cool white light fluorescent lamp. The researchers found that the film is

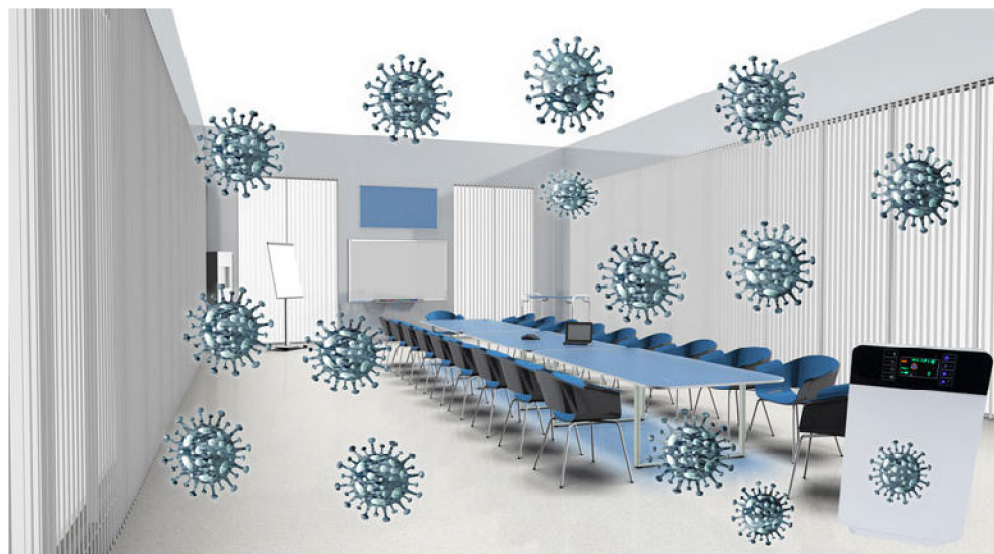
effective at killing all of the viruses – even in a room lit with just white fluorescent tubes. SARS-CoV-2 was particularly prone to photocatalytic inactivation even under very low UV

irradiation conditions, they said.

"This film could replace many of the disposable plastic films used in the healthcare industry as it has the added value of being self-sterilising at no real extra cost," said Professor Andrew Mills from Queen's University Belfast

"Through rigorous testing we have found that it is effective at killing viruses with just room light. This is the first time that anything like this has been developed and we hope that it will be a huge benefit to society," Mills said. The researchers noted that pathogenic viruses like SARS-CoV-2 and influenza will continue to be a global problem for years to come.

"In developing self-sterilising thin plastic films, we have created a low-cost technology that could have a significant impact on the transmission of such concerning viruses in a healthcare environment and other sectors where they are used," Professor Andrew Mills added. - Source : The Week

Qatar ready to mesmerise fans during FIFA World Cup

"The greatest asset is a strong mind. If I know someone is training harder than I am, I have no excuse."

This quote by star Indian shuttler and two-time Olympic medalist P.V. Sindhu is the first thing that catches the eyes on entering the 3-2-1 Qatar Olympic and Sports Museum in Doha, one of only 32 Olympic museums in the world.

Inside, there's a 'Hall of Athletes' that showcases close to 100 athletes and their donated memorabilia.

Walk a couple of steps and, much to the delight of Indian fans, one will find a cricket bat belonging to none other than 'The Master Blaster' Sachin Tendulkar, and right beside it is hockey wizard Major Dhyan Chand's hockey stick.

"In every sphere of life, especially in sport, we must behave in a manner that will make the whole world respect us," reads a quote by the hockey legend, who won three consecutive Olympic golds with the Indian team from 1928-1936.

One will also find jerseys signed by tennis legend Roger Federer, football greats Pele, Zinedine Zidane, and Lionel Messi, and a Ferrari driven by former Formula One driver Michael Schumacher among several other sports memorabilia.

The most decorated Indian boxer, six-time world champion Mary Kom's boxing gloves are

also on display beside a pair worn by the iconic Muhammad Ali.

The museum currently also has an exhibit that has torches from every Summer and Winter Olympic Games starting from 1936, Olympic mascots, pins and medals.

The innovative museum, located in the same complex as the Khalifa International Stadium, one of the eight stadiums that will host matches at the FIFA World Cup, also has many interactive exhibits and inspiring artifacts, and is one of the many attractions that Qatar has to offer to the fans visiting the country for the world's greatest sporting spectacle.

Qatar hosting the first football World Cup in the Arab world is a moment of great pride not only for the locals but the entire community.

In over a decade since the hosting rights were awarded in 2010, the country which began as a fishing and pearl-diving settlement has left no stone unturned to ensure that the football extravaganza is a success.

Qatar's landscape is characterised by glittering skyscrapers and sand dunes against the electric blue of the Persian gulf. It is a blend of Bedouin traditions, modern art and futuristic architecture, which provides a rich cultural experience.

We have developed so much since we were given the

hosting rights. We have got the metro. So many shops have opened," Saad Al-Nabit, a Qatari told PTI.

Air India Express plane catches fire at Muscat airport; all passengers evacuated

All passengers of an Air India Express plane were safely evacuated at Muscat airport following a reported fire on one of its engines. The Kochi-bound Boeing 737-800 flight was about to take off from Muscat when the smoke was detected.

There were a total of 141 passengers, four infants and six crew members onboard the aircraft. Some of them suffered minor injuries during evacuation, reports said quoting officials.

The airline said in a statement that there was no fire warning indication in the cockpit

and the smoke was spotted by another aircraft.

"While it was on the taxiway, another aircraft reported observing fumes from one of the engines. However, there was no fire warning indication in the cockpit. As a matter of precaution, and following the prescribed SOPs, the crew stopped on the taxiway and activated the onboard engine fire extinguishers," it said.

The Air India Express further said that the incident is being investigated by the regulatory authorities and also the airline's

flight safety department. "The airline is extending all facilities to the guests at Muscat. The airline's local management and support staff are on hand at Muscat airport for assistance," it said.

A relief aircraft from Mumbai is expected to reach Muscat on Wednesday night to bring back the stranded passengers.

A senior official at the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) said the regulator is probing the incident and appropriate action will be taken after the investigation is completed. - Source : The Week

BREATH ANALYSER TEST FOR AIRCRAFT PERSONNEL FROM OCT 15

All aircraft personnel, including pilots and cabin crew members, will have to undergo breath analyser test from October 15 onwards, with the DGCA lifting the related curbs that were in place due to the pandemic.

Amid the pandemic, the breath analyser test that is done to check whether

order passed in May 2021.

With the latest changes, all flight and cabin crew members will be subject to the breath analyser test effective from October 15, according to a DGCA order.

In view of reducing number of coronavirus cases and increase in volume of air traffic as well as the dispensation

out the test should check the person first for symptoms of coronavirus infection.

"If any person is detected with COVID-19 symptoms, the person shall be exempted from BA (Breath Analyser) test and be removed from duty.

"Such person shall undergo the required examination and shall return to duty only after having been declared fit. Records are to be maintained for all such cases," the DGCA said.

The regulator also said that such cases should not be treated as missed breath analyser case.

Besides, the person carrying out the test should take a rapid antigen test or any other approved test for COVID-19 prior to joining the duty for the test.

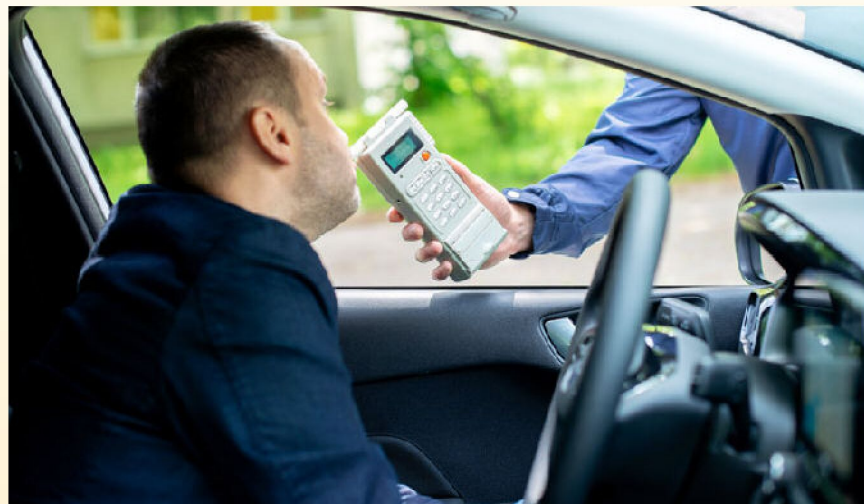
All breath analyser equipment should be sanitised using UV sterilisers, and the integrity as well as sanitary condition of the breath analyser test tubes/ mouth pieces should be maintained, as per DGCA.

The conditions of limiting the number of tests to six per hour and requirement for wearing PPE kit by the medical staff involved in the conduct of the test have been removed.

The restoration of the breath analyser norms will be effective from October 15 as time has been given for airlines and other entities concerned to put in place necessary arrangements for the tests.

The DGCA has restored CAR pertaining to procedure for medical examination of aircraft personnel for alcohol consumption.

Goldman Sachs planning job cuts: Reports

Investment banking giant Goldman Sachs is said to be planning job cuts as early as this month in the wake of a fall in deal volumes and initial public offerings across capital markets.

Reports suggest that Goldman will reinstate its tradition of annual job cuts, which have typically targeted between 1-5 per cent of low performers, a practice that was put on hold in the last couple of years.

The New York-headquartered bank has around 47,000 employees globally. According to US media reports, the job cuts at Goldman are likely to be at the lower end of the range. This could mean a few hundred people could lose

their jobs. Goldman Sachs declined to comment on whether any job cuts were planned and how much.

In India, Goldman Sachs has been servicing clients since

employing over 8,000 people here.

In the Bengaluru office alone it has 6,000 employees, making it one of the largest offices for the bank in the world, according to Goldman.

The Hyderabad office, its newest in India, was opened in 2021.

Equity markets took a big hit around the world in the early part of 2020 due to the Covid-19 pandemic. But, the next 18-months saw markets rally to record levels. In

that backdrop, deal activity also picked up pace and lot of companies rushed to go public, in turn driving an investment banking boom.

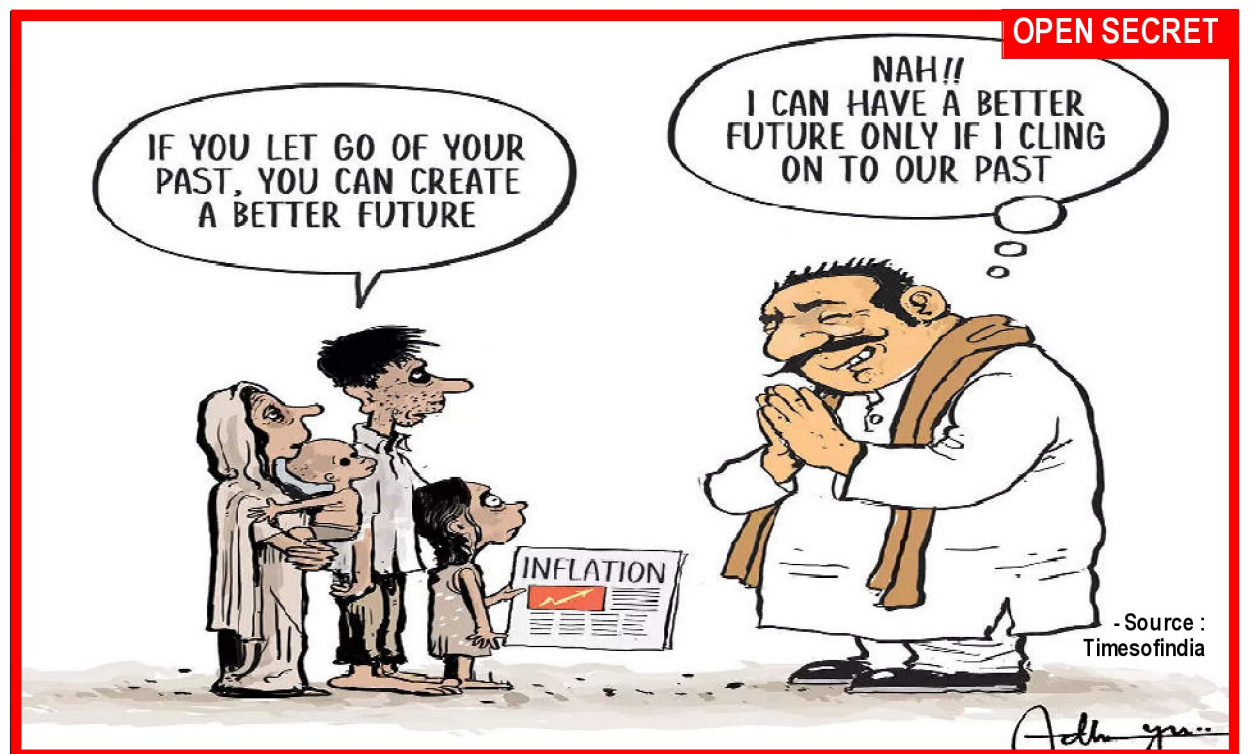
But amid volatile markets,

rising interest rates and fears of a recession in major markets like the US, deals and fund raising has slowed.

The investment bank had warned in its conference call with investors in July that it would have to re-look at its expenses due to the challenging environment.

"Given the challenging operating environment, we are closely reexamining all of our forward spending and investment plans to ensure the best use of our resources," Denis Coleman, Goldman's chief financial officer had said.
